

Urgent: Small Business Owner Alleges Harassment, Unsafe Conditions, and Retaliatory Lease Termination at Fitchburg MBTA Station

FITCHBURG, MA — A 65-year-old grandmother and owner of **Fuzzy's Café** is urgently seeking public support after what she describes as *ongoing criminal harassment* and the Fitchburg MBTA station.

The owner reports a year-long pattern of intimidation, interference with her operations, and unsafe conditions within the station—conduct she believes may rise to criminal harassment under Massachusetts law. She has filed a sworn affidavit and is calling for immediate police and state review. Documentation is available at FuzzysCafe.com.

Despite these concerns, MART abruptly terminated her newly signed five-year lease because an administrative notification was submitted **a few days late**. This action threatens to close the **only business operating within the transit station**, a café that has served riders and the community for more than two decades.

Supporters have placed **more than 50 calls** to the governor's constituent services hotline. Not one caller has received a return call.

“Is the governor aware that her agencies are about to close a small business that serves the poor, disabled, and daily train travelers?” the owner asked. “I am simply asking for fairness and for someone in authority to look at what is happening.”
